Event Coordinator Reports

The 2009/2010 PEI Curling Association Events Final Report

The curling championships went very smoothly this season and there were no major issues to deal with. I have submitted reports on each of the events that I was involved with, so in this report I will only list some general recommendations for future years.

The Tankard – I would recommend that it be reduced to one weekend instead of two in years when there are less than 16 teams registered for the event.

Start of Events - Events should not be scheduled to start until Friday morning. The events will still need the same number of days to be completed, but most of the games would be played on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. If the draw does have to go extras days, (i.e. Monday and Tuesday) there will be fewer teams left that will be forced to take time off school or work. This issue was brought up at the 20 and Under, 17 and Under and the Seniors.

Food/Meals - Food being provided by the clubs should be addressed. Two of the clubs felt that the curling association should be providing more money for food. One club of those clubs felt that money should be provided for every day that the event goes on. Most clubs had no problem with the amount being offered and one club even went beyond what was expected by providing extra food that they were not being compensated for. I'm not aware of any other provincial sports association that provides money for food and I think that this something the curling association should get out of doing. If the host club wants to provide something, that would be up to them as they see fit. If the sponsor wishes to pay extra for food, then fine we should then have munchies, banquet, food vouchers or whatever the sponsor want us to provide. The more money that the curling association spends on food only increases what the curlers end up paying to enter the event. I have heard several people complaining that entry fees were too high already and this just seems like an unnecessary expense.

Thanks - It takes many people to put on a successful event I would like to thank the event sponsors, the club managers/presidents, the event host, ice maintenance crews, Gail Johnson, and the officials that worked the events this season. I would like to give special thank to Stephen Marchbank, Shirley Lank, Derek MacEwen, Cliff Poirier, and Bill Hope and his events committee for their help and patience through-out the season.

This was my third year as secretary, and around my 10th as Webmaster, having started event websites with the Labatt Tankard in February 2000, and starting up the PEICurling.com site in the summer of 2001.

As secretary, I attended and took minutes for all Executive and General meetings during the year, and participated on the Players Committee. The minutes are available on PEI Curling.com.

As webmaster, I maintained the PEICurling.com website, and posted 605 news items, written by myself, the PEICA Executive Director and Executive, Club managers, the CCA, and local media. Much of my work, however, revolved around building results websites for the 14 provincial championships that were held during the season. Most of these sites were moved to a one-page format that is easier for curling clubs to update, and easier for our viewers to see the results.

On the main website, in mid-season, I added links to the popular Facebook and Twitter social networking sites, building links to automatically post our news items these sites. I also made our news feed available for display on the ScreenScape large screen display at the Charlottetown Curling Club.

Following the curling season, I did the first major redesign of the website since its inception, porting it entirely to the WordPress content management system platform, giving it a modern look, and adding new features including a "featured events" display, photo and video galleries, instant access to CCA news, more prominent display of our partners and sponsors' logos, and easier access to our event entry and PayPal payment systems. I will be doing additional work on the entry form during the summer, to cut down on "spam" entries, and to categorize the received entries by event to ensure that none are missed.

Player's Committee Report 2009-2010 for PEICA

The Player's Committee was formed for the 2009-2010 season with the mandate being that the committee would investigate and prepare draws for the five majors that lead to national championships for Prince Edward Island. These were the Scotties, Tankard, Senior Men's, Senior Women's and the Mixed. The idea was to allow the players in each event a choice of play. In the past there had been a number of events were the players had not been consulted and there were problems. This committee allowed the players to select the play by a majority vote and eliminate the problems for the PEICA.

The first event was the Scotties and the ladies chose a triple knockout format with a draw to the button for the hammer each game. There was some confusion as to who controls the hammer in the playoffs and should be spelled out for the future. The event went well and the format was well received. The Labatt Tankard was the second event and we used a triple knockout for the open portion of play and a final six round robin with a three team playoff format for the final. This event went well. Rules which had been omitted such as the seeding of teams, etc. should be reinstated for the men. The third and fourth events were the Seniors. Each choose a triple knockout format with the men drawing for hammer and the ladies chose the flip method. The men's play was the first time they had been allowed a triple format and was well received. The dates for the playoff allowed the committee to offer this format and should be maintained. Even though the first two dates of play were not used this time, it should be kept to allow this flexibility for the coming years. (Clubs with less number of sheets would require more time) The draw for the hammer rule should be put into the rules for next year. Again, spelling out the hammer and colour choices for the playoffs should be put into the rules. The final event of the year was the mixed. With 14 teams the choice of the style of play was limited and the double knockout format was used. The teams voted on the hammer decision, but due to a miscommunication they were not informed of the outcome, so they flipped for the hammer. Again a rule that can be easily fixed for the next season.

The mandate of the committee was to offer flexibility to the players and eliminate problems for the event coordinator prior to the event and we believe we have accomplished that goal. We would recommend that the PEICA continue with a committee for the coming year.
