Welcome Back!

New technology, more club improvements, and two National Championships headline the start of busy season.

Another season has sped by all to quickly, and I hope you have all enjoyed the good times and beautiful weather that PEI summers always bring. Although many of you are still in golf mode, curling season lurks just around the corner and the club has already been a busy place.

Our energy reducing retrofits continued this summer and were completed in September. New shed lights, ice plant improvements and a control panel will all help us use less electricity and water this season while improving the quality of our ice. We have replaced the ageing Ice King with a new Thompson ice scraper, and have installed new monitors for the on-ice cameras courtesy of the Dominion.

Our kitchen was successful last year and will continue to operate during events, rentals and leagues. We will be offering some different dishes this year, and are always open to suggestions. A new bar and serving area was constructed next to the kitchen to enable us to combine the bartender and cook positions during the week while the main bar will be used during weekends and events.

A new Goldline Pro Shop has been constructed in the lobby and will provide a large selection of curling supplies in stock to our members, the public and other clubs.

All of the leagues offered last season will be back, along with a new Getting Started league that will cater to new curlers. Instruction and equipment are included so spread the word to anyone you know who wants to learn the sport.

We are fortunate enough to play host to several championships this season including the Provincial and Maritime Masters, Provincial Firefighters, Provincial Mixed, and Atlantic 17 and Under. The Dominion Canadian Club Championship will be held at our club in November, involving 28 teams from across the country. The Scotties Tournament of Hearts will be played at the Civic Centre, but our members and club will play a prominent role in hosting the event.

All of your favourite bonspiels will be back including the Rodd, Mama Mia, Curl for Cancer, Alpine, Pepsi Junior, Charlabel, and Children's Wish. You will also want to sign up early for Callbeck's Call Back, our golf and curl event in October. Dates and entry forms for all these events can be found in our member's handbook and directory, new this year, or on our website.

Last year was the most successful rental year to date and some weekends are already filling up this season. You can help us continue this trend by spreading the word about the club and the curling opportunities we offer or even posting one of our brochures at your workplace or business.

It certainly promises to be an exciting new season at the Charlottetown Curling Club and I urge you to come on out and get involved as a member or volunteer. If someone you know is interested in curling, please invite them to visit us anytime.

Register for Leagues

Whether you are just getting started with curling or are hoping to go to the Brier or Scotties this year, there is a league for you. Be sure to register October 4-7 from 5-8pm.

Getting Started and Instruction

If you have only tried it a few times or even if you have never stepped on ice before, we have a place for you. Our Getting Started League runs Thursdays at 8:00 and includes one hour of instruction each night for the first half of the season. Membership in this league also includes a gripper and slider, so all you need to participate are a clean pair of indoor shoes and loose warm clothing. Just want to try it first? No problem. Just join us on select Sundays throughout the year for free instruction. See our website for a complete list of dates and times.

Commercial League

If you have a group of friends or coworkers with some curling experience and you would like to curl together as a team, the Commercial League may be for you. With draws on Sundays at 5:45 and 8:00 and Tuesdays at 8:00, this league is open to any team.

Anything Goes

This team entry league is open to any team with any combination of players. This is primarily a social league and meets Mondays with draws rotating between 5:45 and 8:00. More competitive teams are encouraged to sign up on Wednesdays.

Mixed Social

Singles and couples can sign up for this fun league which makes up different teams each week. Some curling experience is suggested. The Mixed Social league runs on Tuesdays at 5:45.

Making Ice

Installing the Ice

We will be starting the ice-making process this year on September 20 and the job will take about two weeks. If you are interested in helping out or just seeing how it is done, please drop by or call the club.

Dividers and Hacks

In an effort to keep the ice cleaner and smoother around the hacks this year, we will be removing some of the dividers and will be installing removable hacks.

This will enable the scraper to overlap sheets and reach behind the hacks.

Jet Ice and Rings

After using Jet Ice for the first time last year I was very impressed. It freezes faster and harder than regular ice and the pebble lasts much longer. We will be using this system again this season. We will also be changing the colour of the rings for the first time in most people's memories. As the host of the Dominion Canadian Club Championships we will be using blue and grey this season.

Control Panel and Rock Conditioning

The biggest improvement in ice quality this year will come from the installation of a new control panel. This will monitor the ice surface and keep the temperature at a constant level. This was only done through guesswork in the past and should give us more consistent speed and curl. The rocks will also be conditioned again this fall to improve curl.

Competitive League and Superleague

Competitive teams can enjoy spirited games with something on the line in each of these leagues. The top 12 teams on the Island play every Wednesday in the Molson Canadian Superleague. With draws rotating between 5:45 and 8:00, only the most competitive teams are encouraged to register for this payper-win league. This league ends in January to accommodate Provincial playdowns. Twelve more competitive teams can sign up for the Coors Light Competitive League which runs on Wednesdays rotating between 5:45 and 8:00. This is also a pay-per-win league but for a lesser amount.

Ladies' Single Entry

It's Ladies only in this fun league which changes up the teams several times during the year. Ladies meet every Thursday at 5:45.

Junior Curling

Registration for Little Rock, One Day, and Two-Day Junior Curling is October 4-7, from 5-8pm.

Barb Murphy will be returning as our Junior Co-ordinator with Connor MacPhee assisting her with on-ice instruction and we will once again be offering several options to our Junior members.

The Little Rock league which caters to the youngest and smallest curlers (7-10) meets Mondays at 4:00. Intermediate curlers meet on Wednesdays at 4:00 in the One-Day League. More advanced curlers can meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4:00 with an option for one- or two-day memberships.

Registration for all Junior leagues will be held October 4-7 from 5-8pm.

Clean Shoes Please!

Sorry, but some footwear just can't be allowed on the ice...



Shoes with metal eyelets or dangling laces leave gouges in the ice with every slide. Dirty footwear can carry sand and salt which ruins the ice. Even the smallest piece of grit can spoil a shot and the game.

Footwear that has been worn outdoors is not permitted on the ice. This rule applies to members and visitors alike.

Please cooperate by investing in a pair of curling shoes or bringing clean indoor footwear. Shoes should have flat soles of soft rubber and no protruding eyelets or hanging laces.

Thank you for helping keep your ice clean!
